

# 2019 Alcona County Fair ADMISSIONS, RULES AND REGULATIONS

#### Section I: ADMISSIONS (FREE PARKING INCLUDED WITH ADMISSION)

1. Gate Admission, 13 yrs. and over, as follows:		
All Days	\$5.00	
Wednesday"Seniors Day" (55 years and over)	\$1.00	
Thursday"Carload Day"	\$10.00	
2. Children, 12 yrs. and under	Free at All Times	
3. Weekly passes, as follows:		
Exhibitor Feed Pass	\$5.00	
General Public Pass	\$15.00	
4. Camping Fee (exhibitors only) \$50.00 per week or \$10.00 per night (No Electrical Hookups)		
(CAMPING FEE DOES NOT INCLUDE GATE FEE)		

Camping registration information will be available during registration weekend.

Section II: GENERAL RULES (Any Deviation of rules will be at the discretion of the Alcona County Fair Board)

NOTICE: The Alcona County Fair Board is concerned with the safety of all persons attending the Alcona County Fair. Any Person(s) threatening another person(s), involved in and/or causing a physical confrontation on the Alcona ARA/County Fair Site shall be expelled and no longer be permitted to enter said property during any activities or events sponsored by the Alcona County Fair Board.

Anyone with a physical disability requiring the use of a motorized cart must have written permission from the fair board prior to the fair. Fair board will determine where cart can be driven.

- 1. Smiles and good times required.
- 2. All dogs must be kept on a visible leash.
- 3. EXHIBITORS should carefully read all rules and regulations.
- 4. Articles/animals not properly entered cannot compete.
- 5. The classes provided herein shall constitute the entire list of entries on which ribbons will be awarded.
- 6. No alcoholic beverages or controlled substances shall be brought onto the grounds.
- 7. Barns will be open from 10:00 a.m. 10:00 p.m. daily.
- 8. Home Arts and Campbell Buildings will be open from 10:00 a.m. 8:00 p.m. daily.
- 9. Rules and regulations set by the Alcona County Fair Board are final and will be strictly enforced.
- 10. Exhibitors assume the risks of exhibiting livestock and other displays. The Alcona County Fair Board will take reasonable precautions to ensure safety of exhibits but in no case will they be responsible for loss or injury.
- 11. Do not place name of owner or advertising on exhibits (except livestock) prior to their being judged.
- 12. Anyone needing services of a veterinarian or a medical doctor shall be responsible for costs of services rendered.
- 13. Premiums will not be paid at the Alcona County Fair. This resulted from the fact the state has eliminated reimbursement for fair premiums. Because premiums will not be paid there will not be any class registration fees. Registration is still required.
- 14. All persons involved with food at the Alcona County Fair must meet all requirements of the Food Law & Codes and any other requirements as determined by law.
- 15. A copy of the County-owned fair grounds Act 11 1929 is available online.
- 16. No dogs or smoking within 40' of the livestock barns.

#### Section III: LIVESTOCK (LARGE AND SMALL)

- 1. All poultry (exempted are waterfowl, pigeons and doves) entered in the Alcona County Fair must have a certificate that indicates they are from pullorum-typhoid clean flock or negative official test for Salmonella pullorum-typhoid within 90 days before the fair. Testing will be available at the fairgrounds, check for the time.
- 2. Suitable stalls/pens will be furnished. Exhibitors will be responsible for the care and feeding of their animals and for keeping their stalls/pens neat and clean. Stalls/pens will be inspected at various times each day. Stalls/pens must be cleaned before leaving fairgrounds. Anyone neglecting to clean up before leaving will pay to have pens/stalls cleaned.
- 3. The department superintendent or supervisor has the authority to assign space to each exhibit and to maintain order. Those not wishing to follow the rules will be asked to leave and forfeit all awards.
- 4. Exhibitor will furnish own hay and grain for their animals, as well as feed and water containers. All exhibits shall be cleaned, watered and fed properly and ready for exhibition by 9:00 a.m. daily. Each exhibitor is responsible for his/her own clean-up equipment such as rakes, forks, shovels, etc.

- 5. Animals are to be exercised in the arena only at times posted. Animals are to be led in and out of barn for exercise and wash rack. No animals in spectator area, on roads or beyond hill north of horse barn.
- 6. Exhibitors will be permitted to bring onto the grounds only a limited amount of feed, hay or baled straw and the fair board reserves the right to refuse admission of such if in their judgment there is an excessive amount.
- 7. Ponies are 54" or less (Exhibitor 13 years maximum). Pony must register in pony class no exceptions.
- 8. All animals for exhibition must be free from any contagious, infectious or communicable disease. Animals that develop symptoms shall be removed from the fair, or by Fair Board permission shall be isolated on the premises.
- 9. Drug Testing (Stimulants, Depressants, etc.) is regulated under Rule 813 for Harness Horse Racing & Pulling Team (a copy is available online).
- 10. Animals are to be in their stalls/pens, unless being judged/exhibited, between 10:00 a.m. 5:00 p.m.
- 11. 'Get of Sire' consists of 3, any age or sex. Produce of Dam' consists of 2, any age or sex.
- 12. Zip ties on cages are optional in poultry and rabbit barn.
- 13. All bucks and rams, 6 months and over, must be trailered the day of exhibition, must be clean and groomed, must be removed from the grounds by 8:00 p.m. same evening.
- 14. All animals must have identification (tags, bands or tattoos) according to state law.
- 15. Livestock exhibitors must be in compliance with animal health requirements as defined by the Department of Agriculture. To find these requirements go to: www.michigan.gov/mda-exhibitinfo.
- 16. The Fair board will not be responsible for loss, injury, or damage by theft, fire, lightning, wind or by any other agency to such livestock, article of exhibition or display.

#### Section IV: ENTRIES, AWARDS, PROTESTS

- 1. All entries must be made in the name of the bonafide owner, grower or producer except group or club displays. Animals must be under care and supervision of exhibitor for at least 90 days preceding the fair with exception of Market Animals that have an age cap.
- 2. After entries close, you may not change or switch department, section or class.
- 3. Exhibits for the handicapped: Entry tags on exhibits, by the handicapped, should include a handwritten letter H clearly visible to fair officials at the time of judging.
- 4. The Alcona County Fair Board reserves the right to reject any entry for just cause. Entries will not be accepted when present facilities are depleted. Space will be given to Alcona County residents first.
- 5. All protests must be in writing and must be in the secretary's possession before 9:00 p.m. on the last day of the fair. Within 45 days of the filling of the protest, the protestor may also file with the MDA.

#### Section V: JUDGING

- 1. No judge shall judge any exhibit in which he/she has a financial, immediate family or club interest.
- 2. Any exhibitor disqualified by the judge will not be eligible for ribbons. 'No time' in horse and pony events will not be eligible for ribbons.
- 3. Where in the opinion of the judge an award is not merited, an award will not be made, whether there is competition or no competition.
- 4. Judges have been given the authority to disqualify any entry if it has been registered in the wrong category.

#### Section VI: EXHIBIT RELEASE

- 1. 'Ye Olde Farmstead' exhibits will be released between 6:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. on Friday.
- 2. All other exhibits will be released at 10:00 p.m. on Saturday and must be out by 12:00 noon Sunday.
- 3. Requests for early release of exhibits will be reviewed by the Fair Board on a case by case basis. Written requests must be submitted to the Fair Board at the time of registration.

#### Section VII: YOUTH RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Exhibitor feed pass will admit exhibitor only, 16 19 years old. If exhibitor is 15 years and under, the driver and exhibitor will be admitted.
- 2. Exhibitor age is computed as of January 1 of the fair year; beginners are 10 years and under, juniors are 11 to 13 years old and seniors are 14 to 19 years old.
- 3. The Danish system of judging will be used, whereas, every youth exhibitor (in youth classes) will receive a ribbon. The only exception being a youth disqualified in fitting and showmanship is not eligible to show or receive ribbons in their performance classes.
- 4. Fitting and showmanship participation is mandatory in order to be judged in other classes of your project. Youth in two or more projects must participate in the fitting and showmanship class in each project. Youth Horse and Pony, Class 214, Leadline (8-under) is exempt.
- 5. 4-H and FFA members will be covered by youth rules and regulations.
- 6. Educational & Demo project areas open to all youth 19 years old and under as of January 1.





- 11. No-animals other than those shown in the market classes shall be sold at the market livestock sale.
- 12. Auction sale order will be determined by the judge's placing during judging.

## Alcona County Fair Board Code of Conduct

As an Alcona County Fair Board Member or Barn Superintendent at the Alcona County Fair, I promise that I will:

- Accept responsibility to represent the Alcona County Fair and its activities with dignity and pride by being a positive role model.
- Respect, adhere to, and enforce the rules, policies and guidelines established and adopted by the Alcona County Fair Board, and be courteous and respectful in dealings with other public in general and volunteers
- Abstain from physical or verbal abuse of others through direct interactions or through use of social media or other communication venues.
- Comply with equal opportunity and antidiscrimination laws.
- Avoid criminal activities.
- Under no circumstances will I possess, sell or consume controlled substances at any time that I am representing the Alcona County Fair.
- Refrain from smoking in areas that are specifically designated as "No Smoking" areas.
- Under no circumstances, attend or participate in a fair event under the influence of alcohol and/or other substances.
- Operate machinery, vehicles and other equipment in a responsible manner.
- Report a violation of the Code of Conduct which I am aware of, to a member of the Alcona County Fair Board.

It is expected that all Alcona County Fair participants and volunteers comply with the Code of Conduct. Failure to comply with any component of the Code or participation in other inapproriate conduct, as determined by the Fair Baord, may lead to being banned from participating in fair functions or dismissal as a volunteer.

NOTE: The Fair Board requires that all violations are submitted in writing and signed by the victim (parent or guardian if under 18 years old) of the violation or inappropriate conduct.

## Michigan 4-H Youth Code of Conduct

Participation in Michigan 4-H programs is subject to the observance of the program rules. Any participant who knowingly violates this Code of Conduct is subject to discipline, up to and including removal from the activity he or she is participating in (at his or her own expense) or the entire county 4-H program. Determination of disciplinary action shall be done with input from the volunteers and staff overseeing the program or activity. Final decisions about discipline will be made by the MSU Extension staff.

#### Michigan 4-H members will:

- Show respect for, and cooperate with, fellow members, volunteers and staff.
- Follow 4-H policies and procedures when participating in any 4-H sponsored event.
- Under no circumstances, commit or threaten violence toward any individual, group or the program.
- Under no circumstances, possess, sell or consume alcohol or possess, sell or use controlled substances at an MSU Extension 4-H youth activity or event.
- Under no circumstances, attend or participate in an MSU Extension 4-H youth activity or event under the influence of alcohol and/or controlled substances including tobacco, electronic cigarettes, etc.
- Under no circumstances, bring dangerous or unauthorized materials (such as explosives, weapons or similar items) to an MSU Extension 4-H youth activity or event.
- Abstain from harassment or bullying of another participant, volunteer or staff member (either in face to face interactions, through social media or other communication venues), particularly when the behavior is disrespectful or regards a person's gender, race, age, sexual orientation, religion, national origin, disability or appearance.
- Not cheat or falsely represent efforts related to 4-H project activities.
